Speaking of giving thanks, we would like to take this opportunity to thank all the parents who were able to make it to the Parent Teacher Conference. Together we achieve more!

The Busy Beez are making great strides in their academics and other developmental domains. We are very proud of the progress they have made so far. The month of November was a fun filled month filled with learning new things. The Busy Beez particularly enjoyed learning about the "First Thanksgiving."

The theme for the first week of the month of December is "Occupations." The children will gain an understanding of specific jobs and occupations in the community. We will discuss a few in class. At home, please discuss your occupation with your child. They can also learn about age-appropriate chores they can do at home for example putting their toys away when they are done playing with them.

The theme for the second week Is "Exercise & Fitness." Being fit and active is a vital part of a healthy lifestyle. The earlier we teach our kids about the positive aspects of regular exercise, the more it will become a part of their everyday lives. These days, there is so much technology, be it video games, TV, or smartphones, that moving our bodies often comes in second to sitting on the couch. Let's get our kids (and ourselves) moving! Here are some ways to teach kids about fitness and some fun ways to get our bodies in shape. Exercises like jogging, rowing, jumping rope, swimming, and even dancing are aerobic exercises. The children will be taught that exercises help increase the heart rate and stamina. Teaching kids to get out and get their heart rate up is vital to their health as they develop. Too much sitting around can cause weight gain and health issues.

"Christmas" is the theme for the third week. The children will learn that Jesus is the real reason for the season. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life (KJV).

The theme for the last week is "Winter." The children will learn that winter is one of the four seasons in some parts of the world. They will also learn that winter is the coldest season, that snow falls in the winter and that trees and plants stop growing in the winter. We will also discuss how some animals hibernate in the winter.

We will also be working on the numbers 6 and 7 and the letters Hh, Ii and Jj. Our Bible stories include "Queen Esther", "Jesus is Born", "Shepherds See the Savior" and "The Wise Men Worship Jesus".

Finally, we would like to wish you and your family Merry Christmas and a happy New Year!

A TIP FOR PARENTS: Promoting Independence

While 3- and 4-year-olds still need plenty of parental help, our preschool experts agree that kids are typically able to do more than many of us think. Here's how you can encourage them: Expect more. Most people have a way of living up (or down) to expectations – preschoolers included. "At school we expect the kids to pour their own water at snack, to throw away their plates, to hang up their jackets – and they do," says Jennifer Zebooker, a teacher at the 92nd Street Y Nursery School, in New York City. "But then they'll walk out of the classroom and the thumb goes in the mouth, and they climb into strollers." Raise the bar and your child will probably stretch to meet it.

Reminders

- **Keep sick children home from school**. If a child complains of not feeling well or shows *any* signs or symptoms of illness, the parents will be called to pick up the child from school.
- Pack at least one extra mask in your child's bag.
- Breakfast is served from 8-8:30 am daily.
- Classes begin at 9:00am each day.
- Do not pack shellfish, nuts, peanuts, or other nut products for lunch or snacks.
- We encourage you to pack fresh fruits and vegetables for your child's lunch.
- Do not send food items that may be choking hazards for young children (i.e., grapes, popcorn).
- Put an ice pack in the lunch box to keep food fresh.
- Use only microwavable containers. Meals must take no longer than two minutes to microwave.
- Keep two complete sets of weather-appropriate clothing (including underwear and socks) at school for your child.
- Crocs and open-toed sandals are prohibited.
- Shoes with Velcro are strongly encouraged, laces can cause a lot of accidents!
- Children should not wear expensive jewelry or bring valuable items to school
- Do not send toys, especially stuffed animals, to school.
- Remove and review classwork that has been placed in your child's folder each day.
